## **COBEC CONTINUES THE TRADITION OF STUDY ABROAD**

Biannual meeting of COBEC at Georgia Perimeter College in Atlanta proved to be huge success due to efforts of Dr. John Anderson and Ms. Debra Denzel.

First we would like to welcome everyone to a new school year. A number of items are in store for the COBEC study abroad trip to Belize at the end of the year, including tuition information, awarded scholarships and upcoming dates and conferences.

First of all, members of COBEC approved a motion to create a one-year memorial scholarship for Martin Aird, the son of Chris and Eve Aird and a student at Sacred Heart Junior College, in Belize, who tragically lost his life in early July.

The Scholarship will be made available for the 2011-2012 academic years and will be offered to any Belizean student attending a COBEC member in Belize to be used at any United States COBEC member school. After a brief discussion regarding the COBEC logo, members reached a consensus on the design and wording. U.S. Caucus Chair Kemppainen will coordinate with Mr. Michael Brennen, immediate past-chair to make the minor adjustments and to move forward with the logo. The logo will be used for stationary and other COBEC specific materials.

According to Jim O'Donnell, from New Mexico State University, the International Student-Teacher/Teacher Exchange Program is now an exchange program where money from outgoing students pay for tuition and participation in the program is held in a separate account. Tuition rates can fluctuate, so to be safe we have to make sure the students' accounts from Belize come in during a timely manner.

Education in Belize in assisting in coordinating these workshops.


## Robin Kratzer Volunteers to Manage COBEC Website
